

Yardley Lewis Worcestershire Directory 1820

Yardley, 4 miles from Birmingham, containing 359 houses and 1906 inhabitants. This parish is very extensive, and has the chapelry of Marston annexed. It has a manufactory of burnt tiles from which the town of Birmingham is chiefly supplied.
